

Substance Use Disorder Director's Report April 2021

- 1. Trainings: the LRE is pleased to be hosting three virtual trainings for the SUD network this spring.
 - April 22: "Collegiate Prevention Training"- aimed at helping prevention providers better work with colleges and universities. This is in partnership with the Michigan Higher Education Network thru Prevention Network and is no cost to the LRE or any participants.
 - May 6: "Racism is a Public Health Crisis" with Grenae Dudley, PhD, LP, President and CEO, The Youth Connection. This training will discuss historic and systemic racism and how this continues to contribute to disparities for minorities across the nation. Awareness, advocacy and engagement is essential to adequately address racism and the social determinants of health. This training is now at capacity of 125 participants.
 - May 11: "Tobacco Cessation Training"-This training provided thru PESI and Dr. Hayden
 Center, will teach clinicians the latest research and clinical information on effective
 tobacco cessation techniques and approaches for clients presenting with mental health
 disorders. The latest findings about how nicotine impacts the brain and body will be
 presented, emphasizing the unique neuroscience research associated with
 tobacco/nicotine dependence. There is still space for individuals to register for this
 training.

LRE staff are working diligently with the provider network and MDHHS to ensure we provide the adequate documentation necessary.
