

## WATER/FLOOD/POWER EMERGENCIES

### FLOOD

- If flood water approach, call your supervisor for instructions.
- Do NOT use the home's water (it may be contaminated). Locate the home's emergency bottled water supply.
- Stay indoors unless directed otherwise.
- If driving when you encounter water over the road: Stop, do not go through water if you cannot see the road. The car could stall and you could be stranded in rising water!

### WATER SHORTAGE

- If there is no water, call your supervisor for instructions.
- Locate the homes emergency bottled water supply.
- Once the water comes back on, get instructions about whether water is safe to drink or cook with, and whether there are other safety steps that must be taken.

### POWER OUTAGE

- Brief outages can be waited out in most homes. Know how long your supervisor wants you to wait for power to be returned before you take additional steps (this will vary from home to home)
- If the phone is not working, make a decision to go to the nearest place where you can find a working phone or use a cell phone.
- Call the Power Company to report the outage and obtain an estimate of time to restore power. Call your supervisor to let him/her know where you are and what is happening at home.
- Be aware that a power outage may mean there are downed power lines in the area. Stay indoors if at all possible. If you must go outdoors or drive, be careful to avoid down lines whether they look "LIVE" or not.
